Ceramic artists have commercial tie-up

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TWO women — a ceramics designer and a designer of dolls — and two manufacturing enterprises — one a kibbutz workshop and one a Haifa factory — are involved in Maskit's programme to combine individual design with mass production

Ceramics designer is Rina Peleg, member of Sha'ar Haamakim, who was commissioned to design tea and coffee sets for "Palceramic" of Haifa. Ruth Sternschuss-Zarfati is the doll designer for her home kibbutz workshop in Kfar Hamaccabi. Works of both artists are on ex-

hibit at "Maskit 6" in Tel Aviv.

Tea, coffee, dessert and breakfast sets—every set consists of seven instead of six cups, thus providing a spare—come in blue, yellow and green and their simple practical style is impressive. For a short period, Rina Peleg's "Palceramic" sets will be on sale exclusively at Maskit 6. Prices run from IL58.50 to IL272.

Ruth Sternschuss-Zarfati is responsible for every bottle-like doll — as seen in the photograph — which leaves the workshop in Kfar Hamaccabi. Her dolls look charming set in small groups as they are painted in very bold colours. They come in two sizes and cost IL10.50 and IL11.50.
